“A Changing Kansas: Implications for Health and Communities”

The population of Kansas is aging, becoming increasingly diverse and concentrating in urban areas. Projecting these demographic trends over the next 50 years, without considering potential major changes in immigration or economic development policies, technological advances or other factors that could have a significant impact on population patterns, yields a picture of an even older, more diverse and more urban Kansas.

These trends and projections will likely have substantial impacts on public health, and highlight some potential challenges for governments, health and human services organizations, education systems, the faith community and other organizations throughout the state. In this session, we will consider and discuss these trends in the context of the root causes of poor health and recent increases in mortality due to stress-related conditions—such as drug overdose, alcohol abuse and suicide.
